Below are just a few examples of the work of **Delta Council** in the region over the past year and looking to the next one. It must be stressed that **Delta Council** alone is not able to accomplish anything. It is through partnerships with local organizations and bodies, statewide agencies, officials, and organizations, federal partners, private business, and a myriad other individuals and entities that **Delta Council** is able to have any success in lifting up the economic and community potential of the MS Delta region. **Delta Council** remains focused on achieving results and would much prefer that the appropriate local, state, or national entities lead the efforts that are necessary to get things done....as long as the regional objectives are met.

DELTA COUNCIL

Preparing for the 2023 Farm Bill and ensuring that the abiding principles of farm law over the past decades remains intact (items such as base acreage, safety net in times of low commodity prices, and looking to the market for planting decisions.)

• Work to strengthen Delta agriculture by staying on top of ever-evolving regulatory issues impacting agri-business, whether it be water quality, catfish inspection, pesticides, Waters of the United States, and dozens of other administrative actions.


- Advocate that any discussions and policy imperatives concerning conservation and climate dollars in the new Farm Bill need to be in addition and not instead of Title 1 safety net provisions.
- Be an advocate for the continuation of the H2A program and ensure that producers and agri-


business have the best information on ensuring compliance.

• Support for public sector research efforts of USDA and MSU at Stoneville, the largest branch experiment station in the world, to enhance the profitability of the largest industry of the region – agriculture. Almost 700 employees, and 175 Ph.D.'s, that come to work in Stoneville every day from our region.

DELTA COUNCI

- Work with private industry and producers to have input on research direction in key programs of work, such as the National Center for Alluvial Aquifer Research Center, the Southern Pollinator Health Center, the USDA Ginning Laboratory, the U.S. Forest Service Center for Bottomland Hardwoods Research, and the National Warmwater Aquaculture Center, among others.
- Maintain support for a comprehensive statewide highway program with an increased excise user fee for a dedicated and continuous influx of funds that will allow roads and bridges to be maintained and built in a consistent and obligated manner.
 - Continue to advocate that increased federal funding for transportation be directed to road and bridge maintenance as has been done the last couple of years.
- Build support for continued work on the Interstate 69 corridor from Canada to Mexico. To date, the states with the least amount of mileage include Mississippi, Arkansas, and Louisiana along the footprint of the federal freight corridor and Delta Council will work with MDOT and our Federal Delegation to continue to take intermediate steps for the buildout of the entire network.





Maintain strong and vocal support for the completion of the Yazoo Backwater Pumping Plant and highlight the injustice and foolishness that has been wrought upon the residents of the Delta by the extreme environmentalists and others who oppose the project.

Support the Governor's Task Force on Sustainable Water Supply to look at any and all solutions that can reduce overdraft of our alluvial aquifer. Pay particular attention to continued research and extension efforts aimed at conservation and also pilot projects and strategies that hold the potential for great strides in water balance.

 Continue our longstanding support for early childhood education intervention in the Mississippi Delta, with particular focus on the Promise Communities that are in three Delta counties.

 Maintain support for the continued funding of our higher education institutions that serve the Delta, including Delta State University, Mississippi Valley State University, and the Mississippi State University Division of Agriculture.

Continue to highlight all pieces of construction and maintenance projects in the Yazoo Mississippi Delta, with particular emphasis on the completion of the Upper Yazoo Project.

 Implement strategies to remove barriers to rehabilitation of watershed dams in Mississippi that threaten property and lives.


 Advocate for key conservation programs that address the Delta's unique soil and water challenges.

 Continue the work of the successful Delta Strong program. To date, three new businesses have located in the region with over 120 individual prospecting visits. Currently working on 9 active projects with over \$170 million in capital investment.

- Delta Wildlife has begun the construction of 9 NRCS wetland reserve enhancement projects, working with partners on Green Tree Reservoir enhancement projects at Delta National Forest and wetland habitat enhancement projects at William C. "Billy" Deviney WMA (Wildlife Management Area) and Mahannah WMA.
- Provided wildflower seed for a butterfly garden at Delta National Forest, sold approximately 2,000 bags of corn, soybeans, and grain sorghum for wildlife habitat food plots that will provide nearly 7,000 acres of additional food and habitat resources for wildlife.
- Completed wetland and feral swine assessments on 59,605 acres of WRE lands, documented feral swine damage on 29,500 acres of WRE, removed 1,298 feral swine, preventing over \$400,000 in economic damages to private lands. A total of 197,766 acres enrolled in NRCS Feral Swine Control Pilot Program.
- Working with the Rice Stewardship Partnership, Delta Wildlife brought almost \$1,000,000 in extra EQIP funds to rice producers in the Delta, bringing the total to \$11,620,350.00 since 2014.

- Provided timber inventories to 885 landowners using remote sensing technology with grant assistance from the Farm Service Agency.
- Delta FARM staff installed 65 pipes for grade stabilization, three weirs, and 2,500 ft of constructed wetland to reduce sediment loading into Moon Lake.
- Delta FARM provided enough cover crop seed for producers to plant over 4,000 acres during the fall of 2021 and, working with EPA, MSU, and NRCS, Delta FARM is evaluating the economic, agronomic, and environmental benefits of cover crops and minimum tillage in MS Delta farming systems.
- Documented voluntary conservation practices on over 600,000 acres using the Delta FARM Personal Conservation Assessment Tool.
