SAYLOR WHEEL MANUFACTURER LANDS IN DELTA







Saylor Wheel LLC is locating manufacturing operations in Greenwood. The project represents a \$23.4 million corporate investment that will create 145 new jobs.

Saylor Wheel will manufacture tire and steel wheel assemblies for the trailer industry with the steel wheels vertically integrated into the manufacturing process. The investment includes the purchase and rehabilitation of an existing building in Greenwood, as well the purchase of manufacturing and nonmanufacturing equipment.

The Mississippi Development Authority is providing assistance in support of the project through the Mississippi Flexible Tax Incentive, or MFLEX. Leflore County and Greenwood also are assisting with the project.

Rehabilitation of the building will soon be underway, and the company aims to begin operations in the coming months.

Raised in Warren County, Mississippi, Lt. Governor Hosemann has substantial experience in the private sector as a businessman and tax lawyer. He is a former partner of Phelps Dunbar, LLP. He received his undergraduate degree in Business from the University of Notre Dame, a law degree from the University of Mississippi, and a Master of Laws in Taxation from New York University. Prior to attending law school, Lt. Governor Hosemann served his country in the United States Army Reserve.

The Honorable **Delbert Hosemann** is serving as the 33rd Lieutenant Governor and previously served as Secretary of State. He and **Lynn**, his wife of 50 years, are members of St. Richard Catholic Church. They are extremely proud of their three children and grandchildren.

eye care to Northwest Arkansas.

Decades of experience as a successful healthcare provider and a small business owner guide **Sen. Boozman's** approach to governing. 



HYDE-SMITH WANTS MORE AG PERSPECTIVES CONSIDERED IN EPA PESTICIDE REVIEWS

MISS. SENATOR ASKS NOMINEE TO COMMIT TO IMPROVING USDA-EPA COORDINATION

U.S. Senator Cindy Hyde-Smith received a commitment from a U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) nominee to ensure agriculture interests are truly considered as the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulates the pesticides on which American agriculture relies.

Hyde-Smith broached the subject during Senate Agriculture Committee confirmation hearing for Xochitl Torres Small, who has been nominated to be Deputy Secretary of Agriculture. Torres Small is currently the USDA Under Secretary of Rural Development.

Hyde-Smith is among a growing number of farm state lawmakers concerned that USDA Office of Pest Management Policy data on pesticides and integrated pest management is not given adequate consideration by the EPA Office of Pesticide Programs in its pesticide registration and re-registration processes.
